Defend Democracy in Benton Harbor!	Benton Harbor City Hall Located at 200 E Wall St.	Saturday, May 7th from 11am to 3pm	The Governor is this year's marshal of the Bloomtime Parade in Benton Harbor, a city where citizens have been stripped of their democratic rights through the Governor's new "Emergency Financial Manager" (EFM) law. Governor Snyder and Republicans in the state legislature passed the EFM law which allows them to unilaterally disband locally-elected city councils and school boards, terminate collective bargaining agreements and other contracts, and make decisions that impact people's lives and livelihoods. The event will start at 11 a.m. and should end around 3 p.m. We will assemble at City Hall, then move to the parade route to greet Snyder and let him know that EFM is undemocratic! WEAR RED (and comfortable shoes; there will be walking involved)

House Republicans approved a \$13.8 billion education budget Thursday that reduces state aid to universities and community colleges by 15 percent and calls for a \$430 per student cut for K-12 school districts on top of the \$170 cut that was done last year.
